

BIRD'S-EYE VIEWS




Architects Mark and Angela Jamison designed Bird House on the Gold Coast in Queensland, Australia, as a home for their young family. The home's unique design maintains a strong connection to the site and its natural environment. The site, which is surrounded by towering gum trees and home to an abundance of native flora and fauna, takes full advantage of the sloping, elevated landscape on which the home is built. Anyone entering the upper living spaces enjoys the feeling of being in a birdhouse among the trees as the natural light and sounds of the forest canopy penetrate the internal environment, with stunning views to the trees, skyline, and famous Gold Coast hinterland. All the while, privacy is maintained while still utilizing the benefits of natural light and cross-ventilation afforded by the passive solar design.
